Application completion requirements

Common Application

- \$60 application fee or application fee waiver; \$70 fee for international applicants
- Official high school transcript(s)
- Official ACT or SAT scores (optional for 2025)
- Approved curriculum certification for home school students

Application components must be received by the application deadline to be considered on time

Regional 1st choice completion requirements - NEW

OSU Application

- \$60 application fee or application fee waiver
- Application for admission (with confirmation that student will graduate from high school)
- Approved curriculum certification for home school students
- Official high school transcript(s) needed only for enrollment or scholarship consideration

Regional 1st choice application fee waiver

Who: students applying to an OSU regional campus directly

When: Apply between Oct. 1 and Dec. 1

How: Use RCW2025 during this period to waive the fee

Note: it takes a few days to remove the application fee from the checklist

Changes to the Common Application:

- There are no changes to the Common Application questions or essay prompts for the 2025 application cycle.
- Applicants are still able to elaborate on “community disruptions” such as Covid-19, natural disasters, or other personal events.

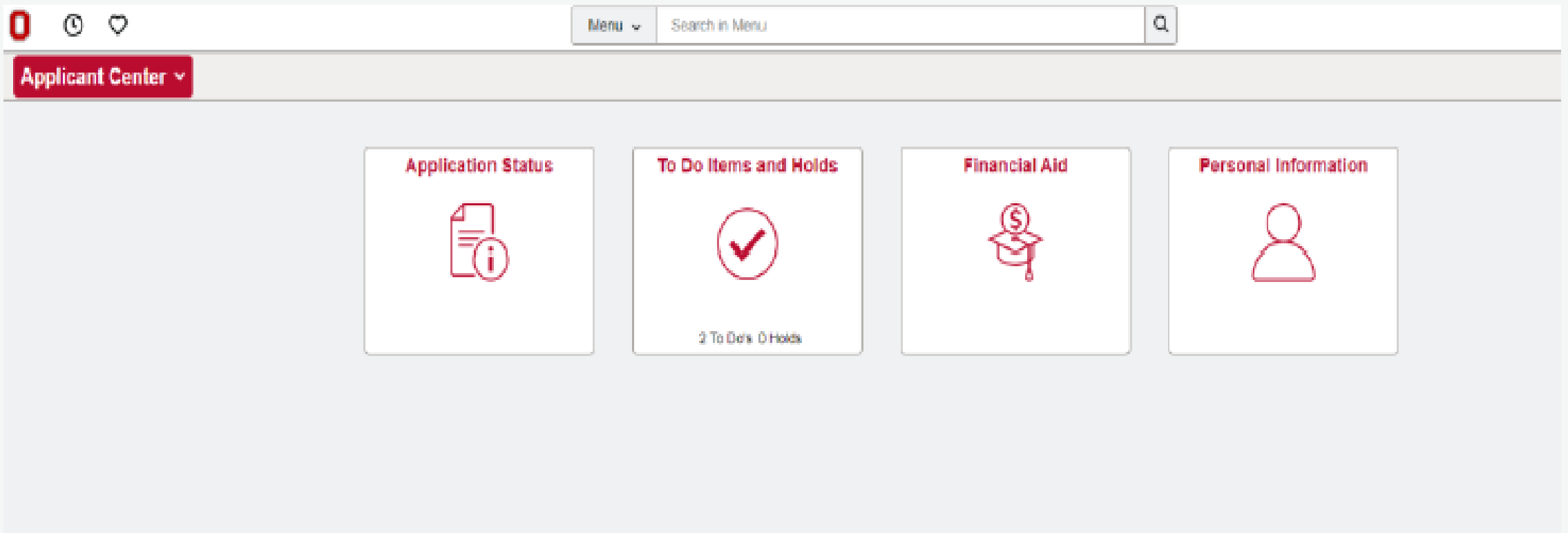

Early action

- **November 1, 2024**, required to apply and complete the application to be considered for most university merit scholarships, including Stamps Eminence Scholarship Program and College of Nursing Direct Enrollment Pathway
- **Strongly recommend to apply by November 1** to be considered for the Morrill Scholarship Program, the Honors and Scholars Programs, Land Grant Opportunity Scholarship, and consideration for majors within the College of Engineering

Regular decision

- **January 15, 2025**, is the final submission deadline

Why request School Counselor Portal access?

- View student application status from your school for first-year and CCP (decisions and merit scholarship awards for the Columbus campus)
- Course schedules for currently enrolled CCP students
- Grades for students who have completed OSU CCP courses
- First year student enrollment to verify who needs a final high school transcript

School Counselor Portal

- Login security is driving the OSU process. Keeping sensitive student data is critical.
- Access is not granted immediately, please plan 2-3 business days. Remember to request it in advance of when you need it
- Counselor access will expire every year. You will receive an email 30 days prior to your expiration with a reminder to submit the same request form to renew your access annually. Taking this step **before** your access expires will allow for a seamless renewal and less steps on your end.

Admission requirements and application review

New First Year Student Admission factors (Columbus campus applicants)

- Successful completion of Ohio State's **minimum college prep requirements**
- **High school performance** (class rank or GPA), including participation in accelerated programs like Honors, AP and IB; Ohio State does not have minimum requirements for class rank or GPA
- **Standardized test score** (ACT or SAT); Ohio State does not have minimum requirements for ACT or SAT scores. Optional for 2025

New First Year Student Admission factors (Columbus campus applicants)

- Experiences that demonstrate **leadership or engaged involvement** (e.g., co-curricular activities, work experiences or military service)
- Status as a **first-generation college student**
- Demonstration of **outstanding talent in a particular area**
- Ability/commitment to **contribute to and engage with a campus community** of people with a wide variety of lived experiences
- Demonstrated personal qualities of **collaboration, determination and resilience**
- **High school performance if adversely affected** by physical, mental or learning environment factors
- Eligibility for and likelihood of **benefiting from organized support services** at Ohio State

New First Year Student Admission factors (regional campus applicants)

- Successful high school graduation from chartered high school or equivalent

Note: Home-schooled applicants must submit an approved “excuse from attendance” verification (or equivalent) provided by a local school district or state official.)

Test optional frequent questions

Q: Is the test optional policy permanent?

A: No, the pilot will continue through applicants applying for AU25. A decision about the policy beyond AU25 will be made in early 2025.

Q: Is there guidance about if I should include test scores?

A: Ohio State's middle 50% for the admitted class was 28-33 ACT and 1340 -1490 SAT. This can be a guide around the decision to submit scores. Since there is no cut off, decisions are contingent upon the composition of the applicant pool.

Q: Can I change my mind after I submit my application?

A: Students may change their selection until the Early Action deadline (Nov. 1) for EA applicants, and by Jan. 15 for regular decision applicants with no specific reason needed. After these deadlines, students may update their choice to no test considered if their test option is cancelled.



Admissions decisions

- **Admit** to the Columbus campus
- **Admit** to a regional campus (Ohio residents not admitted to the Columbus campus are automatically admitted to an Ohio State regional campus (**Optioned**))
- **Deny** to the Columbus campus (non-residents and international)
- **Defer** to be considered again during the Spring review once all applications are received

Changes to ACT/SAT testing

SAT

- The College Board adopted a digital approach to the SAT and PSAT as of March 2024.
- Exams are shorter and are delivered on the computer (no more paper and pencil exams)

ACT

- Scores are now being delivered with a super score if students have tested more than once (Ohio State does not currently super score – best test from a single test date)
- More changes coming for ACT in spring 2025

Proof of English proficiency

- TOEFL (internet-based test or **internet-based test Home Edition**): 79 or higher
- IELTS or **IELTS Indicator**: 6.5 or higher
- ACT: 21 or higher on the English section
- SAT: 27 or higher on the Reading Test
- **Duolingo**: 120 or higher

English proficiency exemption

- Completed three full years of school at a U.S. regionally accredited high school
- Citizen of, or have received a bachelor's degree from, Australia, Belize, British Caribbean, British West Indies, Canada (except Quebec), England, Ghana, Guyana, Ireland, Liberia, New Zealand, Nigeria, Scotland, Singapore, the United States or Wales.

F-1

The most common visa type for international student planning to study in the US. The “student visa”

J-2

The dependents of a J-1 visa. J-1s are typically sponsored by an education or nonprofit accredited by the State Dept to participate in an exchange program.

H-4

Non-immigrant visa for dependents of other H holders.

Examples of H visa holders are seasonal workers from other countries or individuals with specialty occupations like doctors, IT professionals, and engineers.

E-2

Dependent visa for E-1 visa. Visa is for investors, entrepreneurs, and certain employees of businesses

M-1

For international students wishing to pursue vocational or technical training in the US

College of Nursing Direct Enrollment Pathway

Top first year applicants interested in nursing will be considered for early admission to the BSN program. No longer an additional application or essay.

Minimum Criteria for consideration:

- Must be in top 5% of their graduating class
- Have 26 ACT Math or 610 SAT Math or higher
- If test not considered, strong performance in high school, including math.
- Admitted to the Columbus campus as a pre-major in nursing
- Students selected based on their admissions application

With the limited number of seats available for this option, we may not be able to offer Direct Enrollment to nursing for all qualified applicants.

College of Nursing Direct Enrollment Pathway

Process now managed by Undergraduate Admissions, in collaboration with the College of Nursing

Outcomes:

- Offered early admission: 220
- Enrolled: 65 (includes only students who accepted the offer in addition to paying the acceptance fee)

STARS network



Rural and Small-Town Initiatives

- Bus trips bring students from underrepresented counties in Appalachian Counties in Ohio
- Joint travel throughout the U.S. with other STARS institutions
- Buckeye Bound sessions for rural and small-town students
- Phone calls to each admitted students from rural area in Appalachian counties
- Monthly webinars about admissions, financial aid and student experience
- Visits to 37 high schools in Appalachian counties
- New rural and small-town student website

Results:

- **68% (+141)** increase in admits from students attending rural high schools in 32 Appalachian counties
- **20% (+23)** increase in enrolled students attending rural high schools in 32 Appalachian counties
- **19% (+290)** increase in admits from students living in rural areas throughout Ohio

Maximus, Provost and Trustees Scholarships ^

Award amount: \$1,000–\$3,000 (\$4,000–\$12,000 four-year value).

Criteria: Those considered are Ohio and non-Ohio residents (U.S. citizens or permanent residents) who are highly competitive as demonstrated through grade point average, class rank (if available), rigor of high school curriculum, and ACT or SAT scores (if available).

How to apply for Maximus, Provost and Trustees

Applicants who apply to the university by November 1 will automatically be considered.



Land Grant Opportunity Scholarship for Ohio residents ^

The Land Grant Opportunity Scholarship is awarded to students who are Pell-eligible and demonstrate academic merit. 176 Ohio students are awarded each year, with an attempt made to award two students from each county.

Award amount: Full cost of attendance.

How to apply for Land Grant

Ohio residents who apply to the university will automatically be considered. **We strongly recommend that applicants meet our November 1 early action deadline.**

Morrill Scholarship Program

The [Morrill Scholarship Program \(MSP\)](#) offers scholarships and educational enrichment opportunities to academically talented students who are actively engaged in diversity-based leadership, social justice and service.

Criteria: The Morrill Scholarship is awarded on a competitive basis to students admitted to the Columbus campus for the autumn semester following high school graduation. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents of the United States. MSP seeks academically talented high school seniors who will contribute to campus diversity and actively engage as advocates and champions of diversity, inclusion, social justice and academic excellence on campus.

Award levels: Distinction (the value of the cost of attendance), Prominence (the value of in-state tuition plus the nonresident surcharge for nonresidents), and Excellence (the value of in-state tuition for Ohio residents).

How to apply for MSP

On your admission application, indicate interest in MSP and complete the MSP essay. Be sure to include leadership and diversity involvement on the Activity List. **We strongly recommend that applicants meet our November 1 early action deadline.** [Learn more.](#)

Stamps Eminence Scholarship Program ^

Students awarded the [Stamps Eminence Scholarship](#) are part of a select group of undergraduate Honors students that embark on a unique, four-year journey of academic rigor, service and leadership.

Award amount: Full cost of attendance at Ohio State for eight semesters of full-time enrollment, plus an enrichment grant valued at up to \$5,000 accessible after the first year of successful study.

Criteria: U.S. citizens and permanent residents are eligible to apply. All applicants must indicate interest in the [University Honors Program](#) or [Ohio State Scholars Program](#). Finalists are selected based on the strength of their Common Application, a separate Stamps Eminence Scholarship essay and a video introduction. Selections are based on outstanding academic potential, demonstrated commitment to service, and character. All majors are encouraged to apply. There is no “typical” Stamps Eminence Scholar.

How to apply for Stamps Eminence

Three required steps:

1. Apply for admission to Ohio State by the early action deadline of November 1.
2. Indicate interest in consideration for Honors or Scholars on the Common Application.
3. Complete the separate Stamps Eminence Scholarship Application by November 12.

AU24 Regional campus results

New first-year student enrollment in AU24 for regionals and ATI increased **19.2% over the past two years** to 2,668 through renewed enrollment optimization efforts.

Supporting regional enrollment for AU24



- Application fee waiver initiative (Oct – Dec 2023)
- Increase in optioned students in the early action rounds
- Mailed admit letters and new campus-specific brochure to first choice admits
- Mailed admit letters to optioned students
- Piloted direct enrollment communication from five colleges to optioned students

Results:

- **23.5% (+405)** increase in complete first choice applications to regional campuses
- **17% (+1,110)** increase in Ohio residents optioned to regional campuses after early action

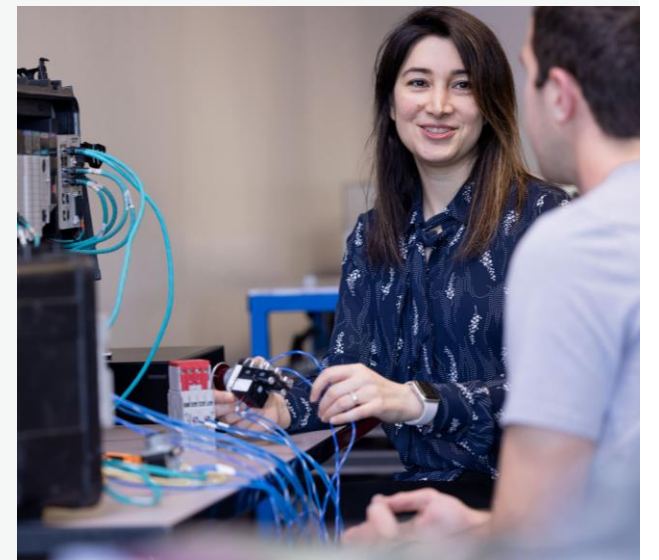
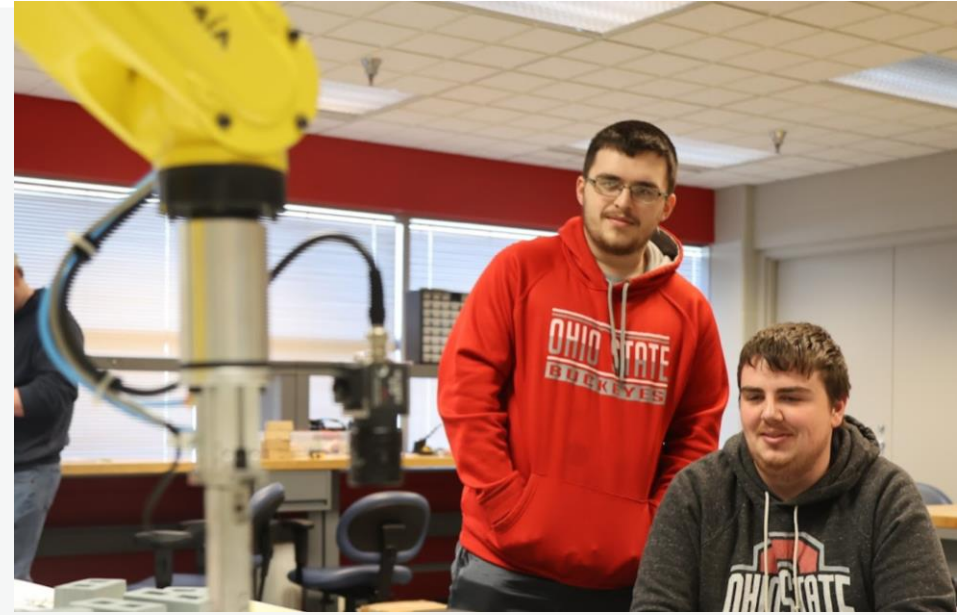
