Changes to admission and decision release deadlines

* December 12: Ohio residents and Stamps Eminence applicants; January 23: non-Ohio residents and international applicants

ACT/SAT test update

Ohio State now requires official ACT or SAT scores from applicants to the Columbus campus for all 2026 semesters.

- **ACT Science changes:** With the ACT Science section now optional, Ohio State will not require students to submit it.
- **Superscore:** Ohio State will now superscore ACT and SAT scores if a student has tested more than once.

Last test dates

The last test dates that will meet our November 1 early action deadline are **October 4 (SAT)** and **September 6 (ACT)**. Students testing on these dates must request that Ohio State receive scores when they register. Students testing on these dates will not be able to view the scores prior to submitting them.

Note: If students have already tested, they should request scores by October 10.

Submitting documents

Counselors should use electronic sources like the Common Application, Naviance, Scoir or Parchment to submit documents for students. If you have something you can't send electronically, email it to ugdocs@osu.edu (replaces esue-studugt@osu.edu) directly from a school address. For Ohio counselors: Email CCP-related documents to ccpdocs@osu.edu. Please don't send us multiple copies.

Honors, Scholars and Eminence

Students should indicate their interest in being considered for Honors or Scholars on the Common Application, and are encouraged to apply by the early action deadline. There is no additional essay.

- If a student indicates an interest in Honors and is not offered Honors, they will automatically be considered for Scholars.
- Students interested in the Stamps Eminence Scholarship Program must apply for that program separately from the Common Application by November 10.

Morrill Scholarship Program

To be considered, students should check the box on the Common Application to indicate interest in MSP and complete the essay prompt. We recommend they apply by the early action deadline.

Financial aid key date: February 1

Every applicant is highly encouraged to file the FAFSA to be considered for the most aid (grants, loans, scholarships and Federal Work-Study).

Five things to know about financial aid:

1. The 2026 FAFSA will open by December.
2. Ohio State's priority date for filing the FAFSA is **February 1**. Students can still submit their FAFSA after that date, but filing before will give them priority aid consideration.
3. Ohio State's school code is 003090.
4. Students should complete a profile and apply for scholarships using ScholarshipUniverse (more on back).
5. Financial aid notifications are emailed to students by early March.

Application updates



Common Application completion requirements

- \$60 application fee or application fee waiver; \$70 fee for international applicants
- Official high school transcript(s)
- Official ACT or SAT scores (required for SP26 and beyond)

Application components must be received by the application deadline to be considered on time



Regional 1st choice completion requirements

OSU Application

- \$60 application fee or application fee waiver
- Application for admission (with confirmation that student will graduate from high school)
- Approved curriculum certification for home school students
- **Official high school transcript(s) needed only for enrollment or scholarship consideration**
- Test scores not required for 1st choice applicants

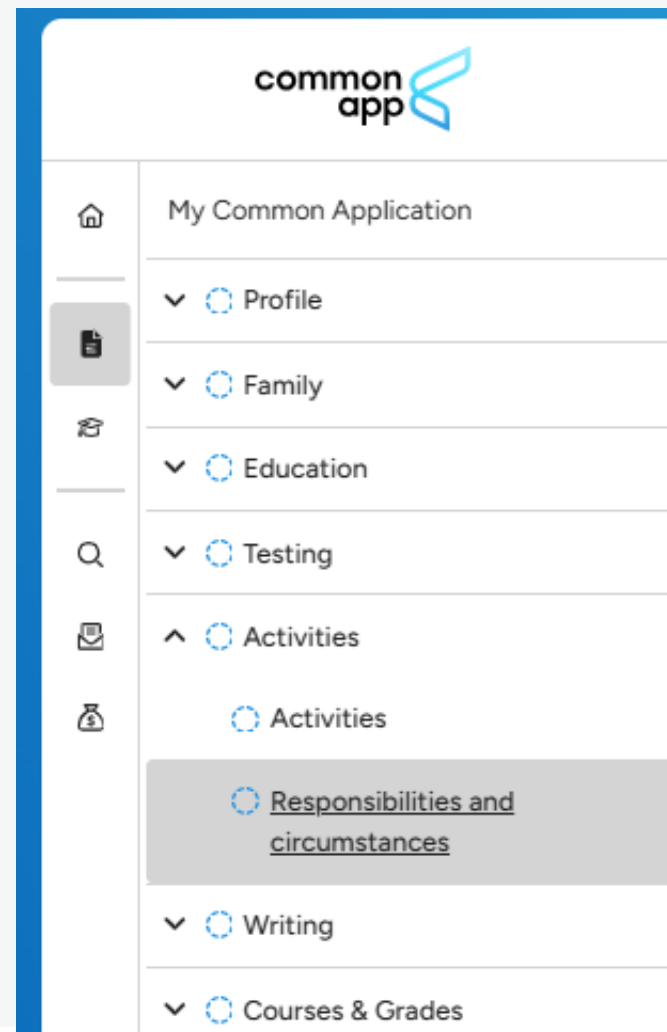
Changes to the Common Application:

Application deadline dates

Early action

- **November 1, 2025**, required to apply and complete the application to be considered for most university merit scholarships, including Stamps Eminence Scholarship Program, President's Ohio Scholarship Program, and College of Nursing Direct Enrollment Pathway
- **Highly recommend to apply by November 1** to be considered for the Morrill Scholarship Program, the Honors and Scholars Programs, Land Grant Opportunity Scholarship, and consideration for majors within the College of Engineering

Regular decision

- **January 15, 2026**, is the final submission deadline

Return to testing – effective Spring 2026

Common Questions

- Test scores must be sent from the testing agency
- Score reports must arrive by application deadline
- Latest tests for early action and regular decision
 - **October 4** (SAT) or **September 6** (ACT)
 - **October 10** – recommended deadline to request scores for EA
 - **December 31** – recommended deadline to request scores for regular decision

Return to testing – effective Spring 2026

Common Questions

- Test scores will be used as one factor in application review
- Test scores will be used in determining university merit scholarships
- Test scores are not used in selecting Morrill Scholars
- **New for ACT:** Science section is now optional. Ohio State will not require students to take the science section of the ACT (similar to the optional writing).

Return to testing – effective Spring 2026

Common Questions

- Middle 50% of admitted students for AU25:
 - ACT: 29-33
 - SAT: 1360-1500
- Number of students admitted in AU20 with test score below 29 (or SAT equivalent):
 - 12,625 admitted (38%)



New: Superscoring test scores

- **What is superscoring?**
 - Superscoring uses the highest subscore from each test and creates a new composite score for ACT or SAT when a student takes the test more than one time
- **How do we determine the superscore?**
 - ACT will deliver a superscore for a student who has tested more than once
 - Ohio State will calculate a superscore for students who have taken an SAT more than once and sends us the scores

New: Superscoring test scores

- **What should students send us?**
 - Sending all score reports is most beneficial to the student. Since we always look only at the highest, lower scores does not negatively impact a student.
- **If the choice is only one send, what should a student do?**
 - Ensure that the scores sent include the highest superscore for ACT and the highest reading and writing and highest math for SAT.

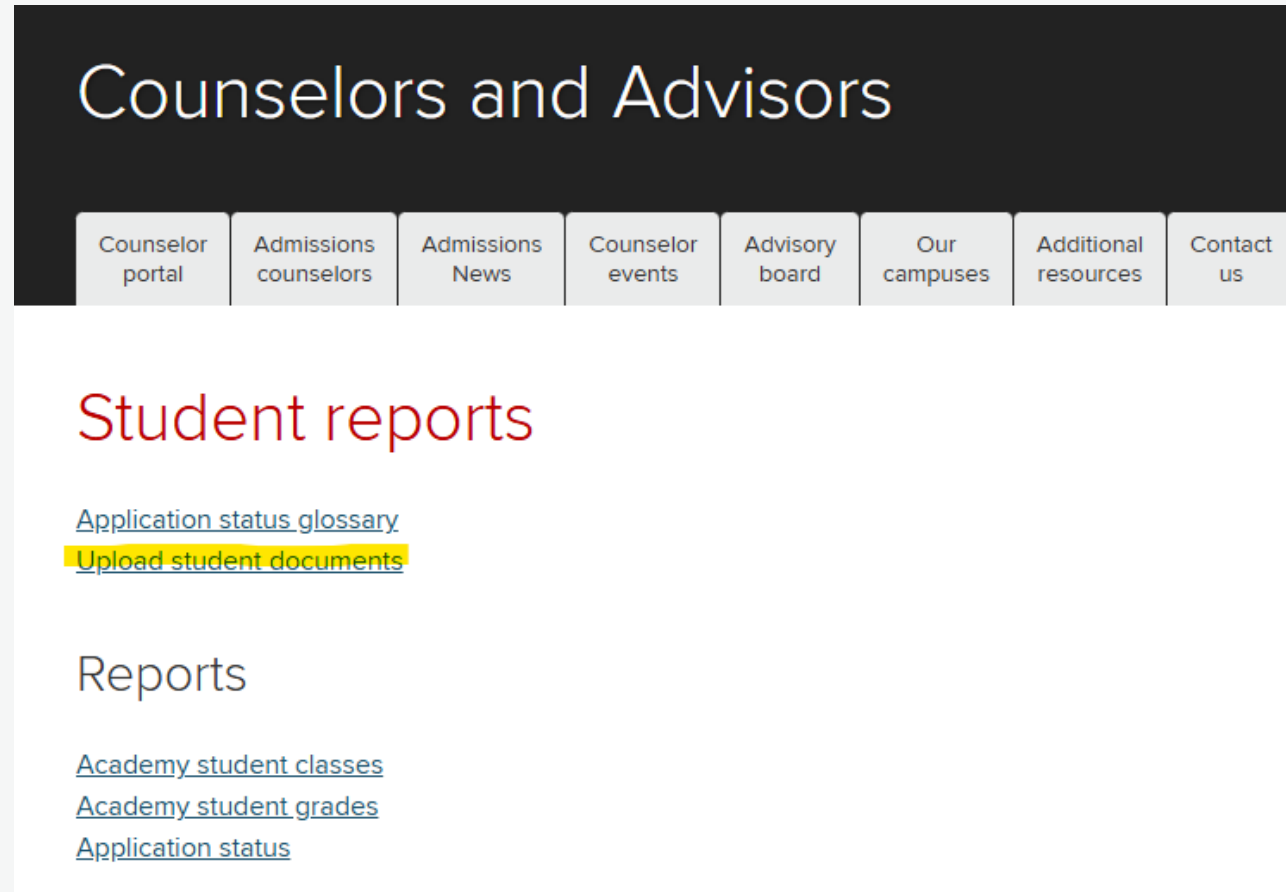

Application review updates



New First Year Student Admission factors (Columbus campus applicants)

- Successful completion of Ohio State's **minimum college prep requirements**
- **High school performance** (class rank or GPA), including participation in accelerated programs like Honors, AP and IB; Ohio State does not have minimum requirements for class rank or GPA
- **Standardized test score** (ACT or SAT); Ohio State does not have minimum requirements for ACT or SAT scores. Required beginning SP26

New First Year Student Admission factors (Columbus campus applicants)

- Experiences that demonstrate **leadership or engaged involvement** (e.g., co-curricular activities, work experiences or military service)
 - Status as a **first-generation college student**
 - Demonstration of **outstanding talent in a particular area**
 - Ability/commitment to **contribute to and engage with a campus community** of people with a wide variety of experiences
 - Demonstrated personal qualities of **collaboration, determination and resilience**
 - **High school performance if adversely affected** by physical, mental or learning environment factors
 - Eligibility for and likelihood of **benefiting from organized support services** at Ohio State

New First Year Student Admission factors (regional campus applicants)

- Successful high school graduation from chartered high school or equivalent

Note: Home-schooled applicants must submit an approved “excuse from attendance” verification (or equivalent) provided by a local school district or state official.)

Proof of English proficiency

- TOEFL (internet-based test or **internet-based test Home Edition**): 79 or higher
- IELTS or **IELTS Indicator**: 6.5 or higher
- ACT: 21 or higher on the English section
- SAT: 27 or higher on the Reading Test
- **Duolingo**: 120 or higher



English proficiency exemption

- Completed three full years of school at a U.S. regionally accredited high school
- Citizen of, or have received a bachelor's degree from, Australia, Belize, British Caribbean, British West Indies, Canada (except Quebec), England, Ghana, Guyana, Ireland, Liberia, New Zealand, Nigeria, Scotland, Singapore, the United States or Wales.

Advising international students in your schools

Review appropriate deadlines and requirements

Deadlines, notifications, and application requirements can vary depending on applicant status

Academic and immigration records

Have student send copies of immigration documents. If there are international academic credentials, originals preferred.

University Registrar and Residency

Student may be eligible for Ohio residency pending visa status and years enrolled at Ohio high school. *Regional campus eligibility



Admissions decisions

- **Admit** to the Columbus campus
- **Admit** to a regional campus (Ohio residents not admitted to the Columbus campus are automatically admitted to an Ohio State regional campus (**Optioned**))
- **Deny** to the Columbus campus (non-residents and international)
- **Defer** to be considered again during the Spring review once all applications are received
- **Wait list** for decisions in March for students who still wish to be considered

College of Nursing Direct Enrollment Pathway

Top first year applicants interested in nursing will be considered for early admission to the BSN program. No longer an additional application or essay.

Minimum Criteria for consideration:

- Must be in top 5% of their graduating class
- Have 26 ACT Math or 610 SAT Math or higher.
- Admitted to the Columbus campus as a pre-major in nursing
- Students selected based on their admissions application

With the limited number of seats available for this option, we may not be able to offer Direct Enrollment to nursing for all qualified applicants.



College of Nursing Direct Enrollment Pathway

Process managed by Undergraduate Admissions, in collaboration with the College of Nursing

Outcomes:

- Goal: fill 80-100 seats
- Offered early admission: 340 offers
- Enrolled for AU25: 126

Maximus, Provost and Trustees Scholarships ^

Award amount: \$1,000–\$3,000 (\$4,000–\$12,000 four-year value).

Criteria: Those considered are Ohio and non-Ohio residents (U.S. citizens or permanent residents) who are highly competitive as demonstrated through grade point average, class rank (if available), rigor of high school curriculum, and ACT or SAT scores (if available).

How to apply for Maximus, Provost and Trustees

Applicants who apply to the university by November 1 will automatically be considered.

Land Grant Opportunity Scholarship for Ohio residents



The Land Grant Opportunity Scholarship is awarded to students who are Pell-eligible and demonstrate academic merit. 176 Ohio students are awarded each year, with an attempt made to award two students from each county.

Award amount: Full cost of attendance.

How to apply for Land Grant

Ohio residents who apply to the university will automatically be considered. **We strongly recommend that applicants meet our November 1 early action deadline.**



Stamps Eminence Program

1. Applicants must apply to the university by the **November 1** early action deadline. When completing the Ohio State admissions application, applicants must indicate their interest in the **University Honors Program** or **Ohio State Scholars Program**.
 - a. *Note: All students that receive the Stamps Eminence Scholarship must be Honors students. If a student has applied for the Ohio State Scholars program and the Stamp Eminence Scholarship Program and is selected as a finalist for the Stamps Eminence program, they will be moved into the Honors program.*
2. Within 1-5 days, the applicant will receive an email that acknowledges Ohio State's receipt of the student's admission application and provides a unique Ohio State username (lastname.#), along with instructions on activating this username and setting up a password.
3. Applicants must then complete and submit the Stamps Eminence application by the **Monday, November 10, 2025 at 11:59 p.m. EST** deadline. The applicant's Ohio State username and password are required to apply. The applicant does not need to wait for an Ohio State's admission decision to submit the Stamps Eminence application.



NEW! President's Ohio Scholarship Program



President's Ohio Scholarship Program will recognize students who earned a perfect ACT or SAT test score from a single test date with a full cost of attendance scholarship and a \$5,000 supplemental award to support educational opportunities.



Who is eligible?

- New, first-year Ohio resident applicants to Ohio State's Columbus campus
- Score a perfect ACT (36) or SAT (1600) test score on a single test date
- Submit all application materials, including a competitive application, official test scores and all other supporting materials by the November 1 early action deadline

Removed barrier

The application fee is a barrier for some students, so we provided an application fee waiver from Oct 1-Dec 1, 2024.



Focus on First Choice Applicants

First choice applicants apply directly to a regional campus and enroll at a much higher rate.



Outcome



New events

Special events like the Buckeye First Breakfast, Buckeye First Friday or the Buckeye FEST for students applying directly to a regional campus.



Personal enrollment appointments

These visits featured 1:1 enrollment appointments and a student checklist.



Bowling with the Buckeyes

A spirited event hosted by the Lima campus allowed admitted students to join current students, faculty and staff for a night of bowling.



Waived the high school transcript requirement



Removed barrier

At time of application, a high school transcript is no longer required for admission.



Focused on Yield

With the barrier removed, regional campus teams could focus on yielding a student earlier in the cycle.

Outcome



Increase in applications

Across all regional campuses, a 6.8% (162) increase in the number of applications.



Increase in admits

9.6% (197) increase in admitted, first choice applicants to the regional campuses.



Increase in enrollment

New first-year student enrollment increased 15% across the regional campuses.

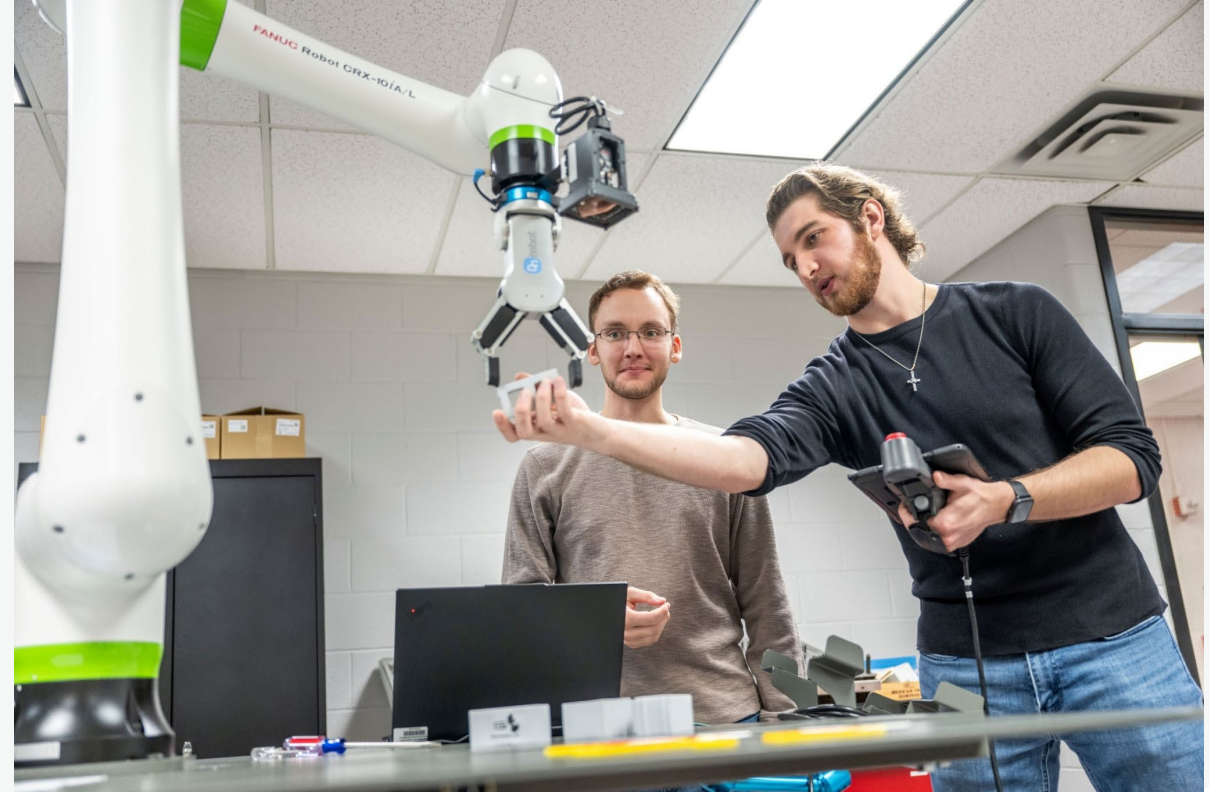
